## Fingerprinting

## Write with invisible ink




Why not use candles or a white crayon to write a secret note. The message can be revealed by painting over the top with watered down paint.

You can also make your own invisible ink with lemon juice and water. Squeeze the juice of half a lemon into a bowl and a few drops of water.

With a paintbrush use the mixture to write a message on white paper. Once dry hold your paper unto the light to reveal the message.
