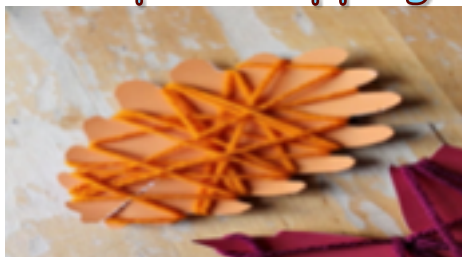


Ideas for 2-3's

Shape Wrapping



With card draw and cut out different shapes. These could be shapes of animals, houses, leaves.

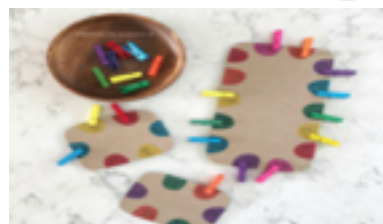
Next get some wool and show them how to wind it round the shape.

Introducing new words such as wrap, round, tight, loose.

This activity is great for colour recognition and counting, as well as developing their fine motor skills.

On a piece of card or paper make a selection of different colours around the edge.

Make sure the colours match to the pegs you have in the peg bag.

Practice Those Mark Making Skills



Fine motor development having control over writing materials. Early mark making skills are the roots to reading and writing.
